Cricket Retrospect.

The weather, such an important factor in the Cricket Season, has not been unkind to us and we have not suffered from drawn or abandoned matches. Our team at the beginning of the term promised well, but it failed to win the majority of matches. The bowling has been stronger than usual, but dropped off after several overs. Clarke has taken a large number of wickets, having a good delivery and keeping a fair length, though being inclined to get short and consider pace of more importance than pitch and direction. Wallace, Knight, and Pattinson have all taken wickets and helped to get our opponents out for small scores. The fielding has not always been what it should be but this can be said of most teams : however we hope as our level piece to the east of the Pavilion is gradually extended, there will be less cause to lay all the blame on the inequalities of the ground. The Batting has

been distinctly better than of late years : there has been a greater desire to defend the wicket, a less anxiety to damage neighbouring property over the boundary. Winter has played several creditable innings and shews good promise of good things to come, but he must refrain from making not only a cross shot but also a blind shot, and remember that it is not necessary to hit the ball much further than the boundary. Pattinson has improved greatly and plays a strong and hard game, but has had bad luck. Clarke, Barker, and Wright have all come on, Barker especially showing good defensive powers. The other two lose their wickets by failing to screw their courage to the sticking place. The one essential elementary thing in cricket is to stand your ground and defy your enemy ; sudden excursions to the leg, or erratic genuflexions towards point are confessions of weakness and preludes to downfall. Wallace through want of practice has not improved much on last year's form : but it was good to see him turn out so regularly to assist the School. Hutchinson's form with the bat is promising. We must not forget to mention Winter's wicket-keeping which has been very good at times brilliant.

Characters of the Eleven.

CLARKE (Vice-Captain).—A very good bowler indeed. His batting has greatly improved, but he should stand up to his wicket more.

PATTINSON.—A very good bat but is too eager to score runs. Would be a good bowler but is too erratic.

WRIGHT.—Has not had much success this season. A good fielder. Plays with a straight bat but must meet the ball and play well forward.

WINTER.—One of the team's best bats. He has a very neat style of batting. A very good wicket-keeper. Fielding excellent.

WALLACE.—Although he has not made large scores he has played very steadily. He has also bowled with success. Fielding rather weak.

BARKER.—A very reliable bat. Very good in the long field. A safe catch.

FAIRBOTHAM.—Has not played often this season. Still hits out too freely. A sure catch.

HUTCHINSON.—Will make a good bat when bigger. Rather slow in the field.

THUBRON.—Defends his wicket well and with determination. A good long stop, but rather slow in the field.

ACKROYD.—Has batted very well on occasions. A good field and a sure catch. Should learn to play with a straight bat.

CLARKSON.—If he defended his wicket more would be a good bat. A good field and a safe catch.

KNIGHT.—His batting has much improved though he fails to give the ball the full face of the bat : might have made more use of his own bowling : set a good example at all times to his team.
